POLITE REMINDER

This year we have a pupil within our setting who is extremely poorly and as a result of this has a weakened immune system. The pupil is therefore highly susceptible to further illness (which could ultimately become life-threatening). It is therefore VITAL that you let school know if your child is unwell and that you do not send them to school before they have fully recovered from any illness.

In the case of sickness/diahorrea can we remind parents/carers that children should be kept off school for a full 48 hours after the last bout of sickness.

Thank you for your cooperation in this very important matter.

School Development Work

This year our priorities are:

- Consolidating the work on whole class reading introduced in 2015/2016
- Introducing the 'Concrete-Pictorial-Abstract approach' in maths
- Introducing a whole school editing policy 'Tranmere Track' aiming to specifically teach children the skills to edit their work
- Extending the 'Learning behaviours' focus from Pupil Mentoring folders to become part of usual classroom practice
- Replacing class bulletins with knowledge organisers
- Introducing our new school ethos each week. We'll tell you about an aspect of this work in detail

This Week: Introducing a whole school editing policy 'TranmereTRACK':

We identified a need to increase the independent accuracy of the children's writing across the school. Errors in capitalisation, basic and year-group appropriate punctuation, spelling and general coherence were holding the children back from higher standards of writing.

So, what we've done, is to develop an incredibly clever acronym to fit the following areas of self-checking in writing:

Track every word; Read for sense; Accurate spellings; Check punctuation; Key features.

This is essentially a school-wide system of cumulative re-reading, whereby at regular intervals during a piece of written work, children stop and 'TRACK' their output so far, checking for the five criteria detailed in the strategy name.

The aim is to culture the children into editing their writing comprehensively before it is seen by an adult, therefore cutting out

basic secretarial marking and ensuring that the non-negotiables of the previous year's learning are adhered to. The punctuation and spelling elements will be directly taken from the child's previous end-of-year expectations, while spellings linked to current learning will be also provided for the children.

How this system is implemented in each year group will vary depending on age, but it is expected that by Year 6, the children will be completely consistent and independent in the completion of this process.

We are already seeing improvements in the children's first-drafts; as you'd expect, given the time and focus to purposefully check their work for basic errors, the results are positive.

Children arriving at school late in the morning

Can we remind parents to ensure they deliver their child to the office if their class have already gone into the building on a morning? We've had reports of parents beckoning other children in their child's class to open the fire-doors/exterior doors to let their child into school, rather than getting the late-mark. This is confusing for the children in the class and a potential safeguarding issue.

Health Care Forms

We are still awaiting the return of a number of Health Care Forms. Can we remind parents that we need all Health Care Forms returned to school even if your child has no known medical conditions or allergy. Thank you.
