# **General School Information/Dates**

#### School Development Work

This year our priorities are:

- 'Closing the word gap' implementing exciting new research on how improving children's vocabulary can directly impact on their achievement at school. In English, we'll also be extending our 'RIC reading' initiative into other curriculum areas.
- An 'outdoor learning' initiative, developing the 'Muddy Puddle' days introduced in the last academic year.
- Developing the **'Knowledge Organisers'** we introduced last year to include maths and English after a helpful suggestion from Parent Forum.
- Actively working on strategies promoting mental health and reducing stress research tells us that children today
  are more stressed than ever before.
- Revisiting 'maths mastery' after introducing this new approach 2 years ago.
- We'll also be reviewing our wider curriculum and interventions strategy for children who need a little extra support.

We will tell you about an aspect of this work in detail each week on the Tranmere Times over the coming weeks. The member of staff leading on that aspect will give you some headlines about the work they'll be leading.

#### This Week:

#### **Curriculum Review and Knowledge Organisers**

It has been well broadcast throughout the news recently that children are feeling more under-pressure than ever before. Each school is ranked and graded according to their results in end of Key Stage tests, so there is obviously going to be a little more emphasis on these core subjects of English and maths at school. However, we always try to make sure that lessons are taught in a fun and exciting way using various hands on resources – so that the children don't even know they are learning!

The other subjects (e.g. geography, art, history etc.) are known as the foundation subjects. This year I have been tasked with the challenge of raising the profile of these subjects and reviewing our whole school curriculum offer. We want the children to have the opportunity to find their talents, whether they are a budding artist, a future Olympian, the next Oscar winning director or a secret historian!

The curriculum review will initially involve some research about different schemes that are currently being used in other primary schools, followed by a consultation with teaching staff. Once we have chosen the best option for our school, I will then deliver training with the hope of trialling the new curriculum in late summer term so that we can begin with a fresh and exciting offer next academic year.

Finally, in parent feedback, you asked for a little more information about what the children will be learning in English and maths each half term so that you could help your child at home. Your wish is my command! Along with teaching staff, I have designed brand spanking new English and maths knowledge organisers that will be available to you from autumn term two!
