### **General School Information/Dates**


We hope you all enjoy the Half Term Holidays and that this lovely Spring sunshine continues. School will re-open on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> February.

**ACC Half Term Fun Day** 


Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> February 12 - 2pm
