Global Climate Strike

Today pupils and staff supported the Global Climate Strike in our own unique way!

The Global Climate Strike has been inspired by 16-year old Greta Thunberg who has sailed across the Atlantic ocean to confront world leaders about the climate crisis. Today, thousands of people across the world have taken part in strikes to show their governments and the world leaders that action is urgently needed to change and stop the effects of climate change.

Children have spent the day researching and carrying out activities to bring a greater understanding of the factors that affect climate change and what the children and their families can do to help and equally what they can do to hinder it. They have looked at deforestation, the oceans and cities to examine what is happening and why it is occurring.

To highlight the contribution towards climate change by the fashion industry, every child and staff member was invited to come in non-uniform, so long as the clothes worn were either ethically produced or sourced, second-hand or bought from a charity shop!

During the day, the children were asked to create displays showcasing what they had learnt using recycled and eco-friendly materials. As a visual representation of the damaging effects of climate change, these displays were sabotaged and ruined by the Year 6 children using (recycled) cardboard oil spills and chainsaws!

In a conclusion to the day, we came together on the playground for a demonstration where banners were waved and speeches were made by class representatives to illustrate what the children had learnt throughout the day and to "make their case" for the protection of key environmental areas!

Mr. Sutton said "Our children are already aware and are engaging with the issues of climate change - whether they know it

or not - so we felt that the Global Climate Strike was an important enough day to further engage with! The children have learnt a great deal today and will hopefully be making changes in their day-to-day lives which will benefit us all!"

The children will be bringing home a checklist with useful tips on what you can all do at home to help combat the effects of climate change. Every little change will help! Teachers will check in with the children in a couple of weeks to see how they are getting on with the checklist!

School Governor Vacancy

A vacancy has arisen for a parent governor on our governing body. Governors need not be experts in the field of education. What they do need is an interest in the school and in the welfare of our children and the time and willingness to get involved. The skills you have can be very useful to the governing body.

Presently, the governing body is lacking governors who have expertise in finance, statistics or analysis. If you are someone with the required experience, would you consider applying? Governors also need what are known as 'soft skills' – the ability to be able to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question, and to make connections between different types of information. All governors are expected to be able to read straightforward budget reports and data on school standards.
