Curriculum Objectives

Pupils should learn how to:

- Use different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command.
- Use expanded noun phrases to describe and specify.
- Use sentence co-ordination using: or; and; but.

Pupils should know how to:

- Form lower-case letters of the correct size relative to one another.
- Begin to use some of the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left un-joined.
- Write capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower case letters.
- Use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters.

Examples

Handwriting The quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog.

Statement –A clear expression of something. I love going to swimming lessons.

<u>Question</u> – A question is an asking sentence and must end with a question mark. It is used in place of the full stop. What time are we having lunch?

<u>Exclamation</u> – An exclamation is usually an abrupt or excited cry or shout. It requires an exclamation mark to let the reader know to emphasise it. <u>Look out!</u>

Command – A command is an order or request, which uses a full stop unless you want it to be stressed (Shut up! Go away!). Put the pencils on the table.

Expanded Noun Phrase

An expanded noun phrase uses adjectives (describing words) to give additional information about a noun/noun phrase.

Noun phrase-The snake

Expanded noun phrase-The scaly, venomous snake.

Coordination

Coordinating conjunctions join two independent (or equal) clauses or sentences to make a **compound sentence**. The conjunctions usually occur mid-sentence and include: and, but, or.

E.g.

I love pizza. I don't like chips.

I love pizza but I don't like chips.

I like animated films. I like action films.

I like animated films and I like action films.

We could go to the park. We could go swimming.

We could go to the park or we could go swimming.
