Did you know...?

- 70-85 million people perished in the war which works out at around 3% of the World Population.
- World War One was fought in the trenches World War Two used the Navy, Airforce, Armies to fight using bombs, missiles and tanks.
- The Victoria Cross is awarded for extreme bravery for the Armed Forces. There were 182 awarded during WW2.
- 6,000,000 Jewish people died during The Holocaust.
- A Polish-Catholic midwife, Stanislawa Leszczynska, delivered 3,000 babies whilst at Auschwitz.
